DHeLiDA Training in Foligno, Italy



On the 28-29-30th June, the DHeLiDA partnership alongside with their chosen trainers gathered in Foligno, Italy to hold the Learning, Teaching and Training activity. The aim of the training was to present the project in more detail to newcomers and to demonstrate the developed Digital Health Framework and the Platform for Collective Awareness on Digital Health that aim to raise awareness on digital health literacy and help disadvantaged adults to gain new digital competences in this field. Trainers at their end will be further spreading the word about the project and its results and in the coming months they will organize trainings for beneficiaries to enhance their skills and improve their health literacy.

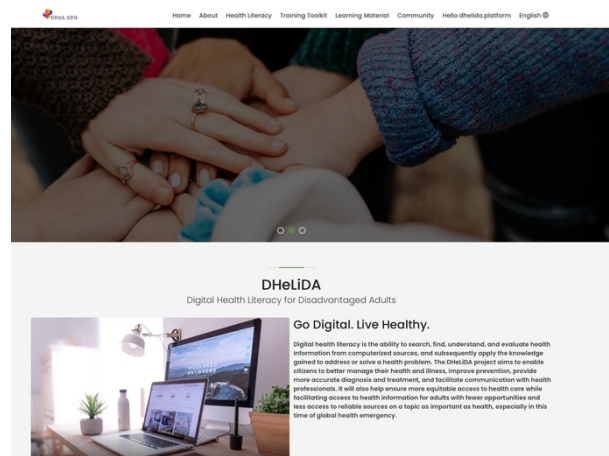
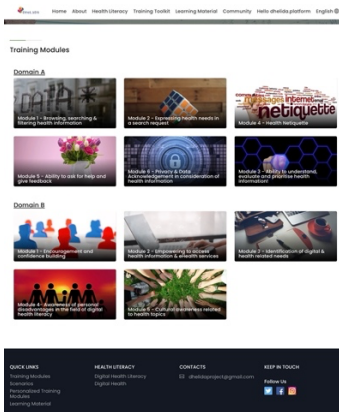
